SECTION TWO: State & Place Profiles

Either its overall population is at least 125,000, OR its overall population is at least 25,000 and its Hispanic/Latino population is at least 20% of the overall population. For those states where less than five places meet either of these criteria, we have included places with total population of 10,000 or more with the highest percentage of Hispanic/Latino population, so that each state is represented by at least five places. This section starts with the state profile, followed by place profiles that meet the criteria above. Places are listed alphabetically within each state. Each profile contains data for 26 topics, if available.
