These homeland security partners can be confident that the information shared will not expose sensitive or proprietary data.

Description: This system replaced the color-coded advisory system to more effectively communicate information about threats by providing timely, detailed information to the public, government agencies, first responders, airports and other transportation hubs, and the private sector. The alerts will provide a clear summary of the potential threat, recommended steps and actions to ensure public safety, and a specified end date to the alert. The advisory will clearly indicate whether the threat is Elevated or Imminent depending on timing and location.
